Report: REVIEW OF PARTNERSHIPS

Purpose of the report

1. To provide Members with information on the deliberations of the Audit and Review Committee and seek approval for the revised list of Authority Partnerships.

Strategic Planning Framework

2. The information and recommendation contained in this report are consistent with the Authority's statutory purposes and its approved strategic planning framework.

Background

3. The attached report was considered by the Authority's Audit and Review Committee (A&R) on 3 August 2007. Members may recall that the A&R meeting followed closely on from the NPA AGM at which a paper on Member Appointment to partnerships was tabled. At the AGM members made a number of comments on the Authority's existing partnerships (where representation is by members) which the Audit and Review Committee were asked to consider. These related primarily to existing partnerships that had not met for some time.
4. The attached Annex contains the complete list of partnerships that the Authority is involved in. New partnerships are shaded and those for which it is recommended for deletion are so marked.
5. Explanations for the deletions are contained in the A&R report on pages 2 and 3. In addition the Committee are also recommending the deletion of the Richmondshire Regeneration Board, which has completed its work in its present form. Following debate on Hudson House, at the AGM, the Committee is also recommending the deletion of the Hudson House partnership from the current list as it does not fit into the criteria as others on the list. Of course this does not mean any reduction in our dealings with Hudson House – quite the reverse.
6. A&R are also recommending a change in the membership of the Pennine Bridleway Steering Group. This would be made up of Mr Macare, Mr Fenten and the Member Champion for Recreation Management. Also a change to the membership of the Yorkshire Dales Access Forum. This would be made up of Mr Brown, Mrs Millward and the Member Champion for Recreation Management.

7. Members will note, that following the decision taken at the July AGM, a number of partnerships have been updated to include the relevant Member Champion as the Authority representative. Following that exercise members resolved that an annual review of partnerships should be undertaken to ensure the continued efficiency of the Authority's resources.

RECOMMENDATION

8. Members accept the recommendation of the Audit and Review Committee and approve the current list of partnerships listed in the Annex.

Report: REVIEW OF PARTNERSHIPS

Purpose of the report

1. To review the Authority's partnership working.

Strategic Planning Framework

2. The information and recommendation contained in this report are consistent with the Authority's statutory purposes and its approved strategic planning framework.

Background

3. Members may recall that, it was in 2002 when the Authority first undertook an exercise in reviewing its partnerships. This was a very intensive piece of work which followed on from an Audit Commission report which assessed whether the Authority's arrangements for ensuring partnership working were effective in assisting us to meet our statutory purposes, objectives and targets.
4. Following that exercise members resolved that an annual review of partnerships should be undertaken to ensure the continued efficiency of the Authority's resources.
5. For a small Authority like the Yorkshire Dales NPA, partnership working is critical to achievement of our aims and objectives. Similarly, our size means the capacity that we have at our disposal, both in member and staff terms. Therefore, the best use of this resource is under constant review.
6. The development of the Authority's partnerships has continued in recent years. A major change was carried out in June 2006 when the Audit and Review Committee reviewed the extent of member involvement in partnerships and, as a result, a number of partnerships leads were changed to members rather than officers. The progress of these partnerships was reported to the AGM in July.

Criteria

7. The regular monitoring and review of the Authority's partnership commitments is a responsibility of the Audit and Review Committee. In carrying out this function, members are guided by the following criteria which were adopted by the Authority in 2003:-

- does the partnership contribute to national park purposes?
- does the partnership contribute to:
 - National Park Management Plan priorities and objectives?
 - Best Value Performance Plan priorities and objectives?
- does the Authority need to be involved?
 - could another partnership provide the same or similar function – such as a Local Strategic Partnership (LSP)?
- does the partnership have clear terms of reference?
- is there an engagement and/or exit strategy?
- is it a task and finish group with a time limit?

Current position

8. The Authority is now involved in 87 partnerships. 8 of these are new and are identified as such on the attached **Annex** (by grey shading). 11 have been deleted; these are also identified on the attached annex.

9. The annex contains information which shows why the 8 new partnerships are recommended for inclusion within the Authority's work. In relation to the deletions members should note the following:-
 1. **Craven Dales Joint Delivery Project Steering Group** – pilot project to test out arrangements for joint working with RDS and EN on delivery of agri-environment schemes. Pilot was completed successfully and joint approach (now with Natural England) will be rolled out across the Park.
 2. **Cumbria Fells and Dales LEADER+ Local Action Group (LAG)** – the current phase of Leader+ funding has ended.
 3. **Yorkshire Dales Housing Forum** - this partnership hadn't met for 4 years! It has now been superseded by the Local Development Framework (LDF) Housing Group.
 4. **Craven Cultural Partnership** – the Authority's relationship with Craven District Council is now via the Yorkshire Dales and Harrogate Tourism Partnership.
 5. **Skipton Tourist Information Centre** – our involvement with the TIC has been superseded by the Craven Tourism Strategy. Proposals are currently being considered, by Craven District Council, to take over the running of Skipton TIC. The Authority's involvement is no longer required at a detailed level.
 6. **Access Management: Defra Group** – the focus of this group is now on coastal access. The representation of the English National Park Authorities has now transferred to a more appropriate authority.
 7. **Cumbria Rural Action Zone (RAZ)** – this group has not met for over a year and it is recommended that the Authority discontinues its involvement.
 8. **Green Lanes Liaison Group** – this has been superseded by NYCC's unclassified/unsurfaced roads liaison meeting.
 9. **Sub-regional Cycle Tourism Task Group** – work has been completed.
 10. **Local Transport Plan 2, NYCC Sustainable Travel Tourism** – the work of this group has been completed.
 11. **Prosperity & Protection Steering Group** – the work of this group has been completed.

Conclusion

10. Balancing the need to engage in partnerships that deliver our objectives with the Authority's capacity remains an important judgement for members and officers. It is considered that the attached annex achieves this balance.

RECOMMENDATION

11. Members approve the current list of partnerships listed in the Annex.
