

UPPER WHARFEDALE CENSUS PROFILE 1991-2001

(Parishes of Buckden, Conistone with Kilnsey, & Kettlewell with Starbotton)



Notes

1. Figures may not sum due to independent rounding & census compilation
2. Any parish that falls below the confidentiality threshold for Small Area Statistics data is merged with a contiguous parish. (Confidentiality threshold in 1991 was 50 persons/20 households, in 2001 the threshold was 100 persons/40 households.)
3. Where parishes are split by the National Park boundary and/or combined with others outside the boundary, an estimate has been made of the percentage in the Park.

Summary

Population stable

Moderate growth in the working population

Household growth is mainly due to increased couple households

Vacant housing and tied housing has declined by half. Outright ownership has increased.
Second home ownership has declined.

Significant growth in the number of Housing Association properties.

Strong growth in economic activity reflecting growth in numbers of working age.

Employment sector is skewed towards hotel and catering.

Higher than Park average of managers and professionals.

Very high proportion of the population walk to work or work at home.

Low proportion of commuters.

Substantial increase in the number of cars.

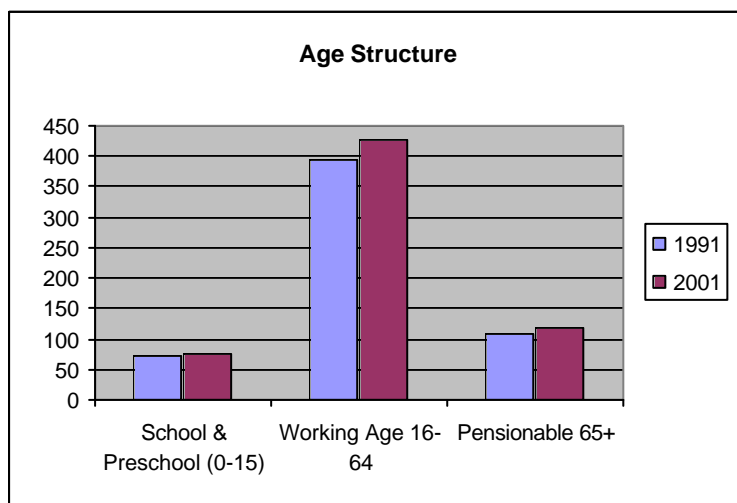
